Middlesex - A Province to be proud of

Middlesex Shines Bright

Since **1 April 2020**, the end of our last Festival, the Masonic Charitable Foundation (MCF, the Freemasons' charity) has granted phenomenal support for Middlesex Freemasons and their families, with **448 grants** made, totalling **£1,567,337**.

This remarkable assistance includes:

- ◆ **£360,005** for children, young people and education
- ◆ **£367,135** for health, care and wellbeing
- ◆ **£840,197** for daily living costs

But the generosity didn't stop there. In addition, the MCF, through the Province of Middlesex, has continued to make a powerful impact in the wider community. Since April 2020, **53 grants** have supported **46 local charities**, providing a further **£444,476** in funding.

That's a combined total of **£2,011,813** directly benefiting Middlesex Freemasons, their families, and local causes. A remarkable testament to the compassion, generosity, and commitment that define our Province.

Generosity and Dedication

These achievements stand as a testament to the extraordinary strength of collective endeavour. None of this would have been possible without the tireless commitment, compassion, and generosity of the Almoners and Charity Stewards across the Province of Middlesex.

Strengthening Middlesex's Local Impact

To deepen our charitable connections across the Province, from the 1st April 2026, the MCF has committed to allocating 25% of all donations made to the 2031 Festival specifically for Middlesex to distribute. This ensures that every brother in Middlesex can have a direct, lasting, and meaningful influence on how future MCF funds are used to support local people, local causes, and local communities.

Like all Provinces, local charities have received numerous grants over the years since the MCF was formed in April 2016. Our grants programme has benefitted over 50 local charities in Middlesex supporting a wide variety of causes and creating an impact on the lives of hundreds of people.

The MCF recognise that Provinces can play a crucial part in ensuring that these grants support local communities in the most impactful way, identifying real areas of need and charities that require the most support.

To help Provinces achieve closer links with these charities, the MCF will allocate a percentage of all donations made to the 2031 Festival specifically for the Province to distribute. Giving our donors the opportunity to have a direct influence over how MCF funds are used.



A helping hand when it mattered most: Jason's recovery through MCF support



In April 2024, Jason was electrocuted by a 33,000-volt electrical current while cleaning windows at work, which caused severe and permanent injuries to his legs and feet and resulted in the loss of his left hand.

“The incident left me unable to work, and sadly, I had to close the business I had worked so hard to build. It has been an incredibly difficult time – physically, emotionally, and financially – and I wasn't sure how I was going to move forward,” said Jason.

Jason learned about the MCF's support from discussions at his Lodge. He decided to reach out and thankfully, they were able to help.

“The MCF provided vital financial support that helped me and my family cover essential living costs, attend hospital and rehabilitation appointments, take much-needed holidays, and make important adaptations at home to regain independence. The entire process was handled with compassion and professionalism; I felt genuinely cared for and supported from start to finish.”

This essential support relieved a significant burden for Jason, both financially and emotionally.

“The help I received gave me and my family the breathing space to focus fully on recovery and rebuilding our lives without the constant stress of finances. It gave me hope and renewed confidence. Since then, I've dedicated myself to raising awareness about electrical safety in the window-cleaning and solar-cleaning industries, using my experience to help protect others from similar incidents.”

“Asking for help can be difficult, but the MCF treats every individual with dignity, respect, and genuine care. Their support changes lives, and I'd encourage anyone in need to reach out and see if you're eligible – you'll be met with understanding and compassion.”

Honorifics

Individual Honorifics

The Province of Middlesex wishes to acknowledge the generosity of its brethren by issuing Festival jewels to all those who donate or pledge to donate a qualifying amount. Upon qualifying as a Festival Steward or attaining a higher honorific, you will be presented with your jewel in open Lodge, or if you choose, you may receive it discreetly.

The Province fully understands that it may not be within every brother's means to qualify for an honorific, and greatly appreciates all donations received and the organising, running, and taking part in events in support of the Festival.

- ◆ Steward: £600 over Festival period
- ◆ Patron: £1,050 over Festival period
- ◆ Grand Patron: £1,500 over Festival period

Lodge and Chapter Honorifics

A series of honorifics have been set to acknowledge and celebrate Lodge and Chapter financial achievements. Certificates will be awarded to units that donate or promise to donate at the following levels, over the Festival period:

(Please note individual donations and Gift Aid will count towards Unit totals)

Lodges

- ◆ Steward: £350 per member
- ◆ Vice Patron: £520 per member
- ◆ Patron: £650 per member
- ◆ Grand Patron: £780 per member

Chapters and Past Master Lodges

- ◆ Steward: £140 per member
- ◆ Vice Patron: £208 per member
- ◆ Patron: £260 per member
- ◆ Grand Patron: £312 per member

Including Gift Aid.

Lodge and Chapter honorifics will be based on the number of members as of 1 January 2026.

Middlesex Province Relief Fund

Pledges over £200,000 for your Lodges and Chapters.

The Middlesex Province Relief Fund (MPRF) recognises that every Lodge and Chapter will be fully committed to the Festival over the next 5 years.

The MPRF has, therefore, set aside over £200,000 to be available to Lodges and Chapters throughout the 5 years of the Festival to support your favourite local charities and good causes. As each Lodge and Chapter reaches an honorific level for its donations to the 2031 Festival, they will receive an application form together with their certificate, which will enable the Charity Steward to claim from the MPRF.

As, potentially, there could be over 800 cheques to be issued over the 5 year Festival, applications should be made as soon as your Lodge or Chapter reaches each level of Festival honorific.

As can be seen each Lodge and Chapter could potentially receive £1,500 to pass on to deserving causes.

Once your Lodge or Chapter has achieved an honorific shown below, your Charity Steward can immediately apply for the following designated amounts:

- ◆ Steward: £250
- ◆ Vice Patron: a further £250
- ◆ Patron: a further £250
- ◆ Grand Patron: a further £750

Therefore, potentially you could receive a maximum amount of £1,500 over the 5 year Festival.

All amounts must be used to support local charities and good causes.






Important Notes

1. This form contains a Single/Regular Donation, Gift Aid Declaration a Direct Debit Mandate and Guarantee. Please complete the relevant parts and pass it to your Relief Chest Representative.
2. All donations for the Relief Chest under a Regular Donation have to be made by Direct Debit from a Bank or Building Society account in the United Kingdom. Bank Standing orders, cash and cheques cannot be accepted for a Regular Donation. The charity is authorised to collect only the fixed amount specified on your form. The charity guarantees that it will make no other collections. Should it do so in error, a full and immediate refund will be made. To allow for both the charity and your Bank to process Direct Debits, this form must be received in the Relief Chest Scheme Office at least two months before the first payment is due.
3. You must complete a separate form for each Relief Chest if you wish to support more than one.
4. Please notify us if you change your name, address or Bank/Building Society details.
5. Tax cannot be reclaimed unless the relevant box(es) of the Gift Aid Declaration overleaf are ticked.
